## New Hillier Street Community Living

Two new community homes, managed by Minda, were officially opened in March by the Minister for Families & Communities and Minister for Disability, the Hon Jay Weatherill.

The purpose-built houses on Hillier Street, Reynella, have been developed as a result of a joint initiative between the State Government and Minda. They will accommodate a mixture of tenants from the state's Urgent Accommodation Waiting List (UAWL) and from Minda's Brighton campus.

With accommodation for five residents each, the homes have been fitted out and furnished by sponsor Kelly & Co Lawyers, who raised \$45,000 at the 2007 Black Tie Quiz Night.

Minda's General Manager, Strategy and Asset Management, Mr Philip Martin, said that while the State Government provided the bulk of funding for community housing through 'Project 105', additional money raised by Minda enabled this funding to be spread further.

"There is a huge demand for this sort of accommodation in the community," he said. "And the houses give the occupants much needed independence and opportunities for community participation.

"We are dedicated to creating opportunities for people with intellectual disabilities and we feel these houses are directly in line with that.

Each house accommodates between one and five intellectually disabled residents plus carers.

Mr Martin said that providing off-campus housing for South Australia's intellectually disabled was vital in helping them make choices in where they wanted to live.

Project 105 is a long term initiative between the South Australian Government and Minda, which aims to provide community based living to all of Minda's clients who want this form of accommodation and to also provide accommodation for those people on the UAWL, who desperately need it.

# From the Managers

**2008 has continued to be a very busy period for Minda as we continue to pursue excellence in client outcomes.**

The new community houses at Reynella offered a fantastic opportunity for Minda to respond to the request of some clients who live on campus to transition to a community of their choice and also to work in collaboration with State Government to assist in placing people from the Urgent Accommodation Waiting List. This has resulted in magnificent outcomes for a range of clients.

Minda is now building on those initiatives by further strategies to respond to the needs of approximately 30 people on the Urgent Accommodation Waiting List and a further 20 people on campus to live in communities of their choice. We will be commencing the client and property development work effective immediately but working over a two-year period to meet this need.

Our Business Services have completed a review of the food delivery systems on the Brighton campus and have presented an excellent paper which looks at refurbishing the Kitchen in a way that enhances client choice and improves the quality and presentation of food.

Day Options continues to work hard to seek a solution to the concerns raised by parents about transportation. We are working closely with the Department of Transport and Office for Disability and Client Services to create a solution which streamlines the use of transport and eases the pressure on families. Clients on the campus continue to receive excellent outcomes from the Leisure Bank Program and this includes increased recreation use and the use of holiday programs for clients.

The recent Family Fun Day was a great success for clients and a great opportunity for Minda to showcase the excellent work that our supported employees and the program attendees achieve in production of furniture and pottery products.

Similarly, we had a very successful Corporate Golf Day in May, which raised \$20,000 towards the purchase of a new 10-seater bus. The Marketing team has worked hard in the creation of this rebadged edition of Vocal Point and is keen to receive any feedback you may have on this publication.

Finally, a big thank you to all of our volunteers at the end of Volunteers Week. We have 360 volunteers who regularly give their time and skills in a range of activities from the Board and its subcommittees to wheelchair repair and assisting clients in leisure and reading activities.

## Japanese Professor visits Minda

Twelve years ago, the Japanese Government commissioned several specialists to develop the nation's de-institutionalisation policy and write the educational curriculum for people with a disability.

In 1996, Minda was fortunate to host one of these government officials, Professor Hidemi, on his fact-finding tour of Australia. His particular interest focused on supporting staff in Japan to identify the early signs of ageing in people with an intellectual disability. He was most impressed with the Broad Screen Check List of Observed Changes (BSCOC) developed by Minda.

He took this tool back to Japan and it was most helpful in assessing clients who were showing early signs of ageing and a dementing condition. He was able to develop training for staff based on the knowledge that he acquired from us here in Australia.

As a result of the research he undertook at Minda all those years ago, Prof. Hidemi is now an Associate Professor of Rehabilitation in the Department of Medical Welfare, Faculty of Health Science, Suzuka University of Medical Science.

In March 2008, Prof. Hidemi returned to visit Minda and see the changes that have taken place over the past 11 years. His return trip also took him to Brisbane to revisit the Endeavour Foundation.

While here, he was able to look at our current practices, particularly in relation to clients who are in Day Options and Business Services. As has happened in recent years at Minda, there is a move in Japan towards all clients being productive and Prof. Hidemi spent time discussing Minda's experiences and progress in this area.

In addition, he was very interested in Minda's Nursing Home - the Pat Kaufmann Centre - as the foundations were being laid for this building when he was here on his first tour. Prof. Hidemi noted that in Japan there are no specific nursing homes to support people with an intellectual disability.

Prof. Hidemi concluded his visit by congratulating Minda on the growth in the number of clients who were now successfully and safely living in the community.



# Brighton Master Plan

## Minda is currently in the process of developing a blueprint Master Plan for its Brighton Campus.

The blueprint is designed to ensure the Brighton Campus operates as efficiently as possible when it comes to Minda meeting its charter of creating opportunities for people with an intellectual disability to lead valued and fulfilling lives into the future.

In 2005, Minda prepared a Strategic Plan to guide its long term future as South Australia's leading provider of opportunities for people with intellectual disabilities.

### This Strategic Plan identified a number of issues that impacted on the Brighton Campus, including:

- The maintenance of appropriate standards of accommodation at Brighton for existing and new clients;
- Meeting the increasing demand for residential aged-care for clients who cannot live in the community;

- The provision of ongoing and possible new or expanded day services, therapy, support, training and administrative services;
- Developing appropriate community integration options for clients;
- Determining investment needs on current and new buildings;
- Maintaining a village feel to the campus; and
- Operating some commercially viable services with intellectually disabled employees from the Brighton Campus.

### The Strategic Plan also identified the need for a blueprint Master Plan for the Brighton Campus to:

- Develop a coordinated and comprehensive vision and clear path forward for the management, operation and development of the Brighton Campus so that Minda can meet the future needs of its clients in a flexible and responsive manner;
- Identify future opportunities for people with intellectual disabilities; and

- Address the social, commercial and environmental considerations confronting Minda;
- Provide for current and anticipated service delivery requirements of Minda.

The first step in the process was to identify professional organisations willing and capable of undertaking the wide variety of tasks required.

From this we received 16 applications, which were then evaluated, based on cultural fit, Master Plan experience, social inclusion, environmental and commercialisation considerations. From this evaluation, a short list was prepared.

These shortlisted candidates were then invited to complete a Request for Proposal.

Three organisations have been shortlisted to date, and further discussions are taking place at the moment.

The successful group will then be appointed to develop the blueprint, which will be a coordinated, comprehensive and clear path forward for the management, operation and development of the Brighton Campus.

There will be several steps involved in the development of this plan, including a detailed consultation process with all stakeholders.

Once the blueprint has been completed, it will go to the Minda Board for approval before being implemented.

Because of the detail required and the extensive consultation process, it is estimated that the Master Plan will be completed around July 2009.

# Opening of Minda's new training facility



In the near future, Minda will pride itself with a state of the art training facility, the South Australian Learning Centre, located in the newly refurbished Rogerson Building, Brighton Campus.

The opportunity to accommodate such a facility transpired in 2003, when the Commonwealth allocated \$900,000 to Minda for the development of a skill centre.

The Minda Board matched this offer dollar for dollar with another \$900,000, leaving \$1.8 million for the development of the centre.

The Centre will provide quality vocational learning and professional development to staff, supported employees and the community services sector to assist their performance at the individual, team and organisational level, and is set to enhance

promotional opportunities and career pathways for staff.

The refurbished Rogerson Building features nine training rooms, a training kitchen, a resource centre, meeting and conference rooms and two information technology/e-learning rooms. The interactive training and conference rooms are equipped with latest technology such as smart boards and video conferencing facilities and are available for hire.

The South Australian Learning Centre is in the final stages of completion, with the first external event scheduled for July. An official opening will occur in November 2008.

# Walking for wheels

Wednesday 28 May - Friday 6 June

Des Rowe and Tony Bini, friends of Minda, put their best foot forward on Wednesday 28 May as they embarked on 'Walk for Wheelchairs,' a 345km regional walking expedition of South Australia, raising valuable funds for Minda.

Walk for Wheelchairs saw the two walking enthusiasts pound the pavement for ten days from 28 May to 6 June to assist individuals with an intellectual disability who are wheelchair bound, with all proceeds going towards the maintenance and replacement of wheelchairs for Minda clients, as well as towards Minda's Day Options Program.

The pair walked north as far as Angaston before travelling south through the Adelaide Hills to Victor Harbor, making their way back to Minda's Brighton campus via Willunga.

The costs of living are extremely high for people with an intellectual disability and in particular, the costs associated with wheelchair maintenance and replacement, with a standard, manual wheelchair averaging \$2,000.

In commenting on their motive for walking, Mr Rowe said "Not only are there huge costs associated with general wear and tear of wheelchairs, but the deterioration of a wheelchair can significantly impact on the lives

and comfort of those with an intellectual disability who are wheelchair bound.

"As a volunteer at Minda, I have observed several cases that highlight the fact that wheelchair maintenance and replacement is a huge problem for intellectually disabled people on campus," he said.

Walk for Wheelchairs was fortunate enough to have the support of Phil McMahon Real Estate and Bank SA as corporate partners.
